In What or in Whom Do You Fear and Hope?

[In What Does God Delight and Desire?] Lesson 2, part 1 -- Sunday, February 4, 2007 Psalms 33:1-22 -- Student Handout

Key Questions:

- 1. What is the underlying **motivation** in any person, much less a teenager, that compels them to stand strong -- boldly without fear -- in the face of opposition from their enemies -- and as in the case of Paul in Galatians -- from even his closest friends & mentors?
- 2. What makes people **WANT** to **stand out** from the crowd when most are desparately fighting to **blend in** with the crowd?

Reflection: Each person here needs to ask themselves the following questions:

- 1. Is there observable differences in my attitudes and behavior compared to my non-Christian friends?
- 2. Why do I so easily cave into what everyone else is doing or desiring ... even after I told myself when I was alone that I wouldn't ... why do I feel so spineless around the crowd?
- 3. In what do I **delight**? What are the ultimate desires of my heart?
- 4. What are those things in which I **boast** when with friends?
- 5. When challenged by others, what is it that I find myself **defending** b/c it is so important to me?

Today's Question:

- 1. What really motivates you to feel, think, believe, value and act the way you do today?
- 2. Whom do you really fear and in whom do you really place your hope?
- 3. Who is bigger in your Mind: God or Men?
